Phonics

Phonic Sounds: Little Wandle sound progression Reading: Blending CVC sounds, rhyming, alliteration, knows that print is read from left to right., Common theme in traditional tales. Spotting diagraphs in words. Show children how to touch each finger as they say each sound. For exception words such as 'the' and 'she', help children identify the sound that is tricky to spell.

Writing

Our learning this term is focusing on the structure of sentences. Building our knowledge of types of verbs and nouns. We will be developing our handwriting and increasing our understanding of how to write in books and form letters correctly and on the line. Reading

We will continue to follow the Little Wandle scheme for our Guided Reading sessions. We will also focus on a chapter book as part of our whole-class guided reading, answering lots of different questions.

Maths

In maths we are working through our place value within 100 and developing our knowledge of geometry. We will be building on our prior understanding of numbers and number formation to support our understanding and reasoning.

Science

In Science we are continuing our understanding of animals including humans but will be looking at how we stay alive and what do we need to keep us alive. We will also be looking at living things and the change in the seasons.

History

We are looking at our local area this term. We will be looking back at the old village and how it has changed over time. Then we will be looking further to Lincoln and the history of our great city.

Computing

This term we are Exploring the world of digital art and its exciting range of creative tools. Empowering us to create our own paintings, while getting inspiration from a range of other artists. Conclude by deciding our preferences when painting with, and without, the use of digital devices.

Religious Education

This term we will be looking at who Christians believe created the world. We will be recognising that the 'creation story' is the big beginning of the Bible. We are also looking at how Christians say thank you to God for the creation of the world.

Personal, Social & Health Education

Our focus is celebrating difference where we will be discussing similarities and differences in our classroom and the wider world. We will be celebrating what makes us unique.

PE

We have two sessions of PE a week. On a Tuesday Premier Education will be working with the children on our multi skills and dribbling. Seeing how we are able to manipulate the ball to move across the ground at our will. On a Wednesday afternoon with Mrs. Stevenson, we will be developing our understanding of dance and how we move to music to create shapes.

DT

This term we will be developing our understanding of what DT stands for and why we use it. We also will be looking at structures and how they are created to support and hold fast. Then we will be creating our own structures to see if we can create a sturdy structure.

Music

In our music lessons this term we will be looking at our understanding of pulse, rhythm and pitch. Building on our prior knowledge and deepening our understanding of how these can affect the sound we make.

Writing

We will be continuing our work on non chronological reports based on our previous topic of mountains. We will also be creating some pieces of writing based on our new topic of WW2, including a recount and narrative.

Reading

We will continue to read a variety of texts covering all genres. The children will be asked to answer questions based on vocabulary, summarising, inference and prediction. Our class book will be The Lion and the Unicorn by Shirley Hughes.

Maths

In maths we will be working on addition and subtraction, area and multiplication. The children will grasp a sound understanding of these concepts in order to propel them forward with the rest of their maths learning.

Science

In science, we will be learning about sound and how we hear things. We will explore pitch an volume, as well as designed some earmuffs!

History

This term in history we will be learning about World War 2. We will have a trip to Metheringham airfield, and explore evacuation, rations and how the war has affected us today.

Computing

We will be looking at stop frame animation. The children will be creating their own animation using the tablets.

French

We are going to be learning how to say and have conversations about the 4 seasons in French.

Religious Education

Hinduism will be the focus of our learning as we look and what it means to be a Hindu: their rituals and beliefs. We will also enjoy exploring the festival of light (Diwali) and how Hindus celebrate this.

Music

We will be exploring a variety of music and learning how we can play together in a band. The children will be continuing their work with LMS, learning how to play the steel pan.

PE

In PE we will be working with premier education to deliver quality PE lessons this term. We will be focusing on Netball and dance. There will be a friendly competitive element to our lessons to help the children develop great sportsperson skills.

DT

We will be looking at creating a pavillion structure. The children will be exploring how to make a strong structure to suit our brief.

Personal, Social & Health Education

Our focus this term is celebrating difference. We will be talking about our families and what makes us all unique and special.

Writing

In English, we will be writing poetry designed to entertain, based on the poem The Dreadful Menace. Following this, we will be writing setting descriptions linked to our topic on WWII. We will also write a letter home from the POV of the protagonist from our book study.

Reading

Our book study this term is 'Once' by Morris Gleitzman. We will also read a variety of extracts from a range of novels, picture books, poetry and non-fiction writing.

Science

In science, we will be learning about evolution and inheritance. We will understand how we gain features from our parents and how adaptation differs from evolution. We will also understand how all living things, including plants, evolve.

We will consolidate our learning on addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, before moving on to fractions

Geography/History This term in history, we will be learning all about World War II, beginning with a trip to Metheringham Airfield. We will be looking at how the war began and the impact that it had on Lincolnshire

Computing

In computing, we will learn how to create short videos by working in pairs. We will develop skills of capturing, editing and manipulating video.

French

In French, we will be learning about 'Do you have a pet?'. This will include looking at the vocabulary of different animals. There will be opportunities for conversation within our work.

Art and DT

Our DT this term will be looking at structures. The children will explore making their own structures for different purposes ensuring they are strong, stable and aesthetically pleasing. The children will explore a range of materials and techniques.

Religious Education

Music
