Phonics

Phonic Sounds: Little Wandle sound progression

Reading: Reading simple sentences with fluency. Reading CVCC and CCVC words confidently.

End of term assessments

Writing

Dominant hand, tripod grip, mark making, giving meaning to marks and labelling.

Shopping lists,

Writing initial sounds developing pressure control.

Drawing club writing, drawing and using imagination to enhance stories.

Name writing activities.

Reading

Joining in with rhymes and showing an interest in stories with repeated refrains. Environment print. Having a favourite story/rhyme. Understand the five key concepts about print: - print has meaning - print can have different purposes - we read English text from left to right and from top to bottom - the names of the different parts of a book

Sequencing familiar stories using pictures to tell the story. Recognising initial sounds. Engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary.

Communication and language

Settling in activities, follow rules and routines
Making friends talk about families and differences, what makes us unique.

Children talking about experiences that are familiar to them

Mastering Number

Pupils will build on previous experiences of number from their home and nursery environments, and further develop their subitising and counting skills. They will explore the composition of numbers within 5. They will begin to compare sets of objects and use the language of comparison. Pupils will: • identify when a set can be subitised and when counting is needed • subitise different arrangements, both unstructured and structured, including using the Hungarian number frame • make different arrangements of numbers within 5 and talk about what they can see, to develop their conceptual subitising skills • spot smaller numbers 'hiding' inside larger numbers

Expressive arts and design

Join in with songs; beginning to mix colours, join in with role play games and use resources available for props; build models using construction equipment.

Exploring sounds and how they can be changed, tapping out of simple rhythms.

Recognise myself and that I am unique

English

Our lessons will focus on the importance of grammar and punctuation. We will focus on nouns, verbs and sentence structure.

Reading

Year 1 will continue to use the Little Wandle Guided Reading Scheme whilst Year 2 will encounter a wide variety of texts, answering questions which focus on retrieval, inference, prediction, vocabulary, summarising and explanation. Our Book Study focus for this term is The Day the Crayons quit.

Maths

We are looking at place value up to 50, making sure we are really secure on our understanding of these numbers. At the end of September, we will begin Mastering Number sessions - exciting!

Science

In Science we will be looking at Everyday Materials and their properties. We also have a seasonal change lesson about Autumn where we will explore our local environment and look at the changes which have taken place.

Geography/History

Our geography this term will be all about transport and travel. We will be using our geographical skills to learn and investigate.

Computing

This unit introduces grouping and labelling in relation to the importance of this within computing.

Music

In music we will focus in our 'musical heartbeat'. This will include focusing on listening, singing and performing.

PE

In PE with our coach, we will be focusing on Fundamental Skills such as throwing and catching. With our teacher, we are learning Multi-skills such as balancing and moving our bodies in different ways.

Art/S & D & T

We will be learning about Pop Art this term, exploring different artists and the skills and techniques used in this art style. At the end of the unit we will make our own final piece in the style of some of our researched artists.

Personal, Social &

Our unit this term is Being Me. We will be exploring the importance of rules as well as understanding our uniqueness. We will look at rewards and consequences as part of our learning and learn about how to make our classroom a safe and fair place to learn.



Writing

We will begin the year by reviewing our understanding of basic grammar and punctuation before introducing our first writing unit - non chronological reports.

Reading

Our whole class book study sessions will explore the story of Arthur and the Golden Rope. This tale includes lots of links to Norse myths to tie in with our current geography topic.

Maths

In our first maths sessions we will focus on our understanding of place value using numbers up to 10,000. This unit also includes rounding numbers and learning Roman numerals.

Science

In science, we will be learning all about the properties of solids, liquids and gases. We will also experiment to explore what happens when they are heated and cooled.

Geography

In geography, we will be exploring Scandinavia. We will learn about both the physical and human geography of this part of the world and consider how it compares to the UK. We will also look at what makes it such a popular tourist destination.

Religious Education

In RE we will be looking at the Trinity and why it is important to Christians. We will be looking at baptisms and how they differ as well as understanding the importance of them. We will be looking at stories of baptism in the Bible especially the baptism of Jesus.

French

Our first topic will look at key greetings including how are you? and what is your name? We will also learn numbers to 10 and a selection of different colours.

Computing

We will be looking at how to create our own branching databases to sort and group different items.

Music

In music, we will learn about rhythm and pitch, exploring how they work together to create different sounds and moods. We will also practise listening for these elements in songs and try creating our own musical ideas using them. Throughout the unit we will sing, listen to a range of music, compose and improvise.

In maths, we will first focus on place value before moving on to column addition and subtraction. This will also include rounding numbers and working with negative numbers.

Geography/History

Religious Education
