Change to School Hours from Summer Term 2023/24 -Consultation

The government recently changed their guidance around the length of the school day. The DfE expects all mainstream state-funded schools to provide a 32.5-hour week (or 6.5-hour days) by September 2024.

To ensure that we are compliant we need to lengthen our school day by **20 minutes** and plan to start this from Summer Term 2023 (From 16th April onwards).


This will change our times as shown:
